
ABOUT THE BOOK

PRE-READING ACTIVITIES

- Take a picture walk of the story, 1 flipping each page and pointing out the illustrations. Encourage students to predict what will happen in the story.
- 2 Host a class-wide discussion about the title. Why did the author choose that title? What might we be reading about?
- Create a mind map, documenting what 3. students know about the traditional story of The Gingerbread Man. Then, use the chart to compare and contrast after reading.






<u>Step-by-step to-do list:</u>

- 5. For younger students, (1st grade and younger) you may want to complete this activity as a whole group or encourage students to draw rather than write.




- 1. Copy the craft templates on coordinating construction paper or on white copy paper for students to color.

- 6. Last, will use a glue stick to glue the final craft and writing prompt to a larger piece of construction paper


